Tuskegee students must meet the following criteria to apply:

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- In the second (sophomore), third (junior), or fourth (senior) year of their undergraduate training
- Pursuing a STEM major

To apply, please submit:

- A cover letter (no more than 1 page, typed) explaining in general why you believe diversity and inclusion are important in society, careers, and/or the workplace. Also, express your interest in the potential of pursuing graduate work and a career in the field of toxicology.
- A resume or vitae with 3 references that we may contact
- Unofficial TU transcript
